View Alerts in EMR



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View Historical Alerts in iPM

- Right click on the Patient ID, hover over Patient and left click on Patient Alerts.
- The Alert may have already been moved to EMR in which case this alert would have an end date and a comment advising Alert Moved to EMR.



Add an Infectious alert on EMR

- 6. If the Alert has not been moved to EMR, you must add this alert.
- 7. Click on '**Dx, Problems/Alerts**' under the Table of Contents (TOC)
- 8. Click on +Add under 'Problems' to add an alert as seen here **
- Select Folders and click on Common Alerts.
- 10. Click once on **Infectious Risk** and choose the appropriate Risk from the list that opens.
- 11. Hit the 'Refresh' button and verify the alert has been 'Recorded' in the blue banner bar as seen here
- 12. As the Infectious Risk alert is now in EMR ensure to end date the alert in iPM.



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
