Add an Infectious alert on EMR

- If the Alert has not been moved to EMR, you must add this alert.
- Click on 'Dx, Problems/Alerts' from the Table of Contents (TOC)
- Click on +Add under 'Problems' to add an alert as seen here @
- 9. Select Folders and click on Common Alerts.
- 10. Select Infectious Risk folder
- 11. Choose the infectious risk alert by double clicking on it.
- 12. This will then display on the Problems window. Complete the information and select OK to save it.

- Hit the 'Refresh' button and verify the alert has been 'Recorded' in the blue banner bar as seen here
- 14. As the Infectious Risk alert is now in EMR ensure to end date the alert in iPM.
