Observations – Observation Alerts



Digital Health Quick Reference Guide

This Quick Reference Guide will explain how to:

- These Alerts only appear when accessing and refreshing the Observation Chart. They do not appear when accessing the Vital Signs record via the Interactive View band.
- Out-of-normal range observations entered in the **Observation Chart** will trigger an immediate Yellow or Red Alert
- Out-of-normal- range observations entered into the Vital Signs fields in iView will be displayed with a red exclamation mark
- Out-of-normal range observations entered in iView are visible in the Observation Chart and they will trigger a Yellow or Red Alert when the Observation Chart is opened
- A Yellow or Red Alert will persist until the out-of-normal range vital sign is superseded by a normal range entry (or the patient is discharged from that encounter)
- In general ward areas: Red and Yellow Alerts **MUST** be actioned according to the instructions on the alert pop-up
- If an "abnormal" vital sign is charted, either an Urgent Clinical Review (Yellow) or Met Call (Red) alert will appear as shown

Select the appropriate action response. The alert will reappear each time a new abnormal entry is made or after the action response time is exceeded on the EMR.

7. The abnormal vital sign triggering the alert is identified by a Yellow or Red triangle in the left hand column.

You <u>must</u> make an Urgent Clinical Review - phone any home unit Doctor Inform Nurse In Charge <u>and</u> If Adult patient - Consider Activating ADULT SEPSIS PATHWAY. Following a screen refresh, re-alert: Immediately After 15 minutes After 30 minutes This action will only suspend YELLOW ALERTS

> You <u>must</u> place a MET Call. Dial 22 22 and phone the senior home unit Doctor Following a screen refresh, re-alert: Immediately After 15 minutes After 30 minutes This action will suspend All RED and YELLOW ALERTS





- The appearance of the Alert window may be suppressed for a period of 15 or 30 minutes. However, this does NOT cancel the Alert and it must still be actioned appropriately.
 - The Alert pop-up window will reappear after the suspension time of 15 or 30 minutes has expired.



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Important Note: There is <u>NO</u> automated calling in the EMR. You must call 444 for CODE BLUE and MET Calls or the appropriate Medical Officer for Urgent Clinical Review.

- 10. This will open the **Escalation Method** Powerform

Click on the appropriate radio button and select the **Green Tick**

This entry will be documented in **Escalation** of Care on the **ISBAR Handover** page.

11. If a **Met Call** was called, the **ICU Nurse Responder** will click on the **Rapid Response Record** link and document an overview of the incident
